## **“Waiting for the Wonder”**

With Katerina Whitley’s permission, I am borrowing the title of her wonderful book of Advent reflections for a four Sunday sermon series that I will be preaching. During the holy season of Advent, our Nave will be adorned with blue hangings on the Altar, lectern and pulpit. We will be using the more penitential Rite I for our Celebrations of the Holy Eucharist and we will also light one candle each Sunday in our Advent wreath as we wait for the wonder of the Light of Christ coming again into our lives.

As part of your Advent preparations, I encourage you to read and reflect on the four Gospel lessons assigned for each of the four Sundays: Matthew 24:36-44 (Advent 1, November 28), Matthew 3: 1-12 (Advent 2, December 5), Matthew 11:2-11 (Advent 3, December 12), Matthew 1:18-25 (Advent 4, December 19). I will be focusing my sermons on themes of keeping awake, being prepared, recognizing Christ, and being open to God being with us always.

### **Collect for the First Sunday of Advent (Book of Common Prayer page 159)**

Almighty God, give us grace that we may cast away the works of darkness, and put upon us the armor of light, now in the time of this mortal life in which thy Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge both the quick and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Ghost, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

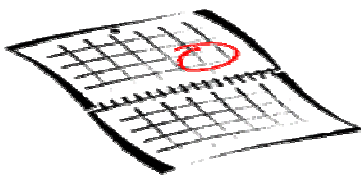
**November 28: Youth Help Organize Foster Children's Christmas Presents**

It seeks to help people grow in faith "by providing rich and varied material about God, faith and spirituality." It has articles, meditations, podcasts, and daily hours of prayer.

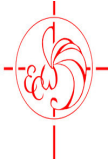

Pam gave announcement about the upcoming service with Naim Ateek at First Presbyterian in conjunction with Holy Comforter  
Reminder of the upcoming Annual Meeting on Nov. 14 and John Moulton will be here to preach on Nov. 21 about Food for the Poor ministry

A request has been made by a First Baptist member to use our sanctuary for their wedding because of construction there. The discussion will be tabled for discussion later.

Pam gave a clarification of her policy concerning the Rector's discretionary fund
