INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

The snow at Christmas and several weather episodes since then have reminded us to consider our inclement weather policies and to update our communications plan for these events. Pam Webb and the Vestry discussed these matters at the January Vestry meeting and set a policy which is summarized below.

1. The Rector, or in the absence of the Rector, the Priest-in-Charge has the authority to cancel services of Holy Eucharist in the event of inclement weather.
2. If both services of Holy Eucharist are cancelled on a Sunday morning due to inclement weather, a reading of Morning Prayer may be offered at 10:30 am.
3. Communication of changes in the regular schedule will be made as follows:
 - a. The answering machine on the church office phone (336-227-4251) will have a message regarding any changes in the schedule.
 - b. A posting will be made on the official Holy Comforter FaceBook page regarding any changes in the schedule.
 - c. The following television and radio stations will be notified regarding any changes in the schedule:

News-2 DigTriad
WBAG Radio 1150 AM
 - d. When possible, schedule changes will also be posted to the Church website and sent to the Holy Comforter email distribution list via "e-mail blast." Work is in process on the technology with respect to these communications.

Everyone should use good sense and put safety first in deciding whether to come to church in the event of inclement weather, regardless of whether services have been cancelled. This policy applies to worship participants, as well as members of the congregation. If services of Holy Eucharist are being held, worship participants who do not feel it is safe for them to attend should follow customary procedures to give notice of absence. Parishioners who are interested in being trained to lead Morning Prayer in the event of inclement weather should contact the Rector or the Senior Warden.

A NOTE FROM OUR NEW RECTOR

Journey to Egypt

On January 30th, my wife and I will be leaving for a 3-week trip to Egypt. We'll both be going in order to participate in a pilgrimage organized by a group of Episcopalians (including my mother-in-law) from the Diocese of Western North Carolina. The purpose of the pilgrimage will be to examine the early Christian history of this country with special attention given to the witness of the monastic tradition that developed in desert monasteries only a few hundred years after Christ. The trip will include 2 nights camping under the stars in the Sinai Desert; lodging at the monastic guesthouse of St. Catherine's, visiting St. Anthony's Monastery and St. Paul's Monastery in the Arabian Desert, as well as hiking to the summit of Mount Sinai. There is no doubt that this pilgrimage will be the trip of a lifetime and yet it will not be the only life-changing part of our journey.

This pilgrimage has also created the opportunity for me to come a week early in order to meet and get to know my Egyptian family for the very first time. I am half-Egyptian and have sisters and brothers, cousins, aunts, and uncles – even grandparents – who all live in Egypt and whom I have always wondered about but never had a chance to know. Since my parents divorced when I was an infant it has been the dream of my biological father to have me come to Egypt and now, as he has recently said to me, “that dream is finally coming true.”

I am his eldest child (the oldest of 7) which means a great deal in the traditional Muslim society from which he was raised. I was named “Adam” as a compromise between my parents since it is pronounced similarly in Arabic as it is in English. Many have wondered, over the years, why this trip has not already happened but, for a variety of reasons, making the journey has always felt very complicated for me. If I am honest, I will admit that some of these reasons relate to my own fear of the unknown whether it is of an unknown culture or language or religion.

This trip to Egypt, therefore, will be deeply personal for me and one that will surely be transformative on a number of levels. I hope it will be a trip not only to deepen my spirituality and to discover the Christian roots of this country but also to better appreciate the beauty and rich traditions of the Muslim family of which I am inextricably linked.

Although I am excited to go on this journey, the trip brings up a variety of anxieties. I therefore ask for your prayers as Courtney and I prepare practically *and* emotionally to make this pilgrimage and know of our continued prayers for each of you and for the entire parish of Holy Comforter.

I look forward to finding ways of sharing this experience with the parish once I begin my ministry as your rector in April. Blessings on your own life's journey,

LUTHER'S CORNER

On January 1, 2001, the full communion relationship between The Episcopal Church and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America became official. It had been approved by the ELCA in 1999's Churchwide Assembly and in 2000 by TEC's General Convention. On Epiphany Day, January 6, 2001, a magnificent celebration of this new relationship took place in the National Cathedral in Washington, DC. Cecelia and I were privileged to be among the several thousand people who were present for the celebration.

The procession of bishops from both church bodies, along with their special invited guests, took almost 40 minutes, and it was a wonderful sight to behold. The majestic organ accompaniment made it quite a joyful time. The colorful vestments, not all of which were alike, of course, along with banners representing the various dioceses and synods, were inspiring, to say the least. Since mitres are not commonly worn by Lutheran bishops in this country, (although they are frequently worn in Europe) the Episcopal bishops very graciously did not wear their mitres at this celebration. The worship service and holy eucharist was presided over by the ELCA's then presiding bishop, the Rev. Dr. H. George Anderson. The preacher for the occasion was the Rt. Rev. Frank Griswold, then TEC's presiding bishop. Wonderful music was provided by the world-renowned St. Olaf College Choir from Northfield, MN.

There was a reaffirmation of Baptism by all present, and it was celebrated from a temporary baptismal station with font located in the center of the main aisle of the cathedral, rather far removed from the altar. Several people dipped branches into the font and sprinkled droplets on all of the congregants as a part of the reaffirmation, and it was very moving. I have been in many places where the singing of hymns seemed to be quite special, but I believe that the singing that day, in that context of the cathedral, with the great joy of the relationship that we were celebrating, will probably stay in my mind and heart as the most moving of my life. The walls truly resounded with the voices and the instruments, and it brought tears to our eyes. It almost seemed to be a culmination, for me, of the years that I had been privileged to spend as pastor of the Church of the Good Shepherd in Galax, VA, that very small but truly grand Episcopal and Lutheran congregation, where we lived out that full communion relationship, with the knowledge and blessing of both the Episcopal and Lutheran bishops for nine years before that grand Epiphany of 2001. It is because of that celebration and the action that precipitated it that I can serve as celebrant and preacher on occasion here at Holy Comforter. I am grateful to TEC and the ELCA and especially to Holy Comforter for making that possible.

Ruth's Story, Our Story

Finding Ourselves in a Biblical Narrative Saturday, February 5 9 a.m. - 1 p.m.

Dr. Julia O'Brien, Old Testament professor at Lancaster Theological Seminary, will lead a half-day workshop at First Reformed UCC in Burlington on Saturday, February 5.

"Ruth's Story, Our Story: Finding Ourselves in a Biblical Narrative" will show us how well-told stories move us, change our moods and attitudes, and spark ah-ha moments about ourselves and our world. In the characters we most love or hate, we see ourselves, our friends, and our enemies; in the complexities of plot, we recognize how choice and chance shape a life. Exploring our reactions to stories in the Bible, we'll compare our responses to the book of Ruth. We'll pay special attention to how we fill in the "gaps" of this story — the information that's not given and the motives that aren't named. Through the process of journaling, small group conversation, and "reader's theater," we'll play in the intersection of sacred stories with our own.

A native of North Carolina, Dr. O'Brien received a B.A. in religion from Wake Forest University and received the degrees of M.Div. and Ph.D. from Duke Divinity School. Prior to accepting her current position in 1997, Dr. O'Brien taught at Meredith College in Raleigh.
